Last month, I began researching the bcmPEACE apartment



building on Derry Street. I began this work in preparation for researching grants. I felt it was important to know about the history of the place. Most of what I have found has been trivial, yet interesting nonetheless. I still don't know exactly when the structure was built, but I've learned it was there in 1895. I found old city directories online

and from them, I learned that the downstairs was once two separate retail shops. Over the years the downstairs was home to a tailor's shop, a draftsman, and a store that sold stoves for heating and cooking. Over the years, there was also a railroad ticket office and a barber shop. CF Still and Son was a shoemaker who at one time had a shop in the building.

The basement still has secrets to reveal as well. I found the remains of an elevator used to move goods to and from the basement. While the car itself is gone; the hoist motor is still there. There are also the remains of a filled- in cistern that would have provided water to the building. One room has a concrete pier. Whatever it housed is long gone. I originally thought it might have been a motor generator providing electricity back in the building's early days. However, on closer inspection, I think it was a refrigeration motor and there was a walk- in freezer downstairs.

In the next few years, we plan improvements to the building. Its bones are quite good. Some of you probably don't know that I have some hands-on experience in historic preservation. I spent many years doing research and improvements at a historic theater and vaudeville house back in Oklahoma. I got to stand on the same stage upon which the famous magician Harry Houdini once performed.

In other church related news, I accepted the job of scraping and painting the handrails outside the church. Many years of paint have been removed and, in short order, they will look new again. The lamp post is next on my agenda.

Thanks to Matt Hunn, the broken light fixtures inside the church are lit again and more are being upgraded to LED. This will save us money in lighting bills and brighten up our space. The Community Classroom is going well. We have on average of seven kids. All are well behaved and eager to learn. We held a Halloween party for them in the last week of October.

Two of us from the Ubuntu house went to a give- away at the Carlisle Presbytery office in Camp Hill that was closing operations. We picked up some nice artwork and a chair for the house. We also obtained some office supplies for the church. The past month was indeed filled with research, adventure and service! *Daniel Wright*,

As I sit down to write this in the wake of our most recent election (we still don't know the result as I'm writing), I'm struck by all we as a congregation have been through this year. Our nation seems staunchly divided along party lines and different people's perspectives on reality or truth are quite different depending on one's point of view. We have been through a global and nationwide pandemic that has made being

together all but impossible. And most recently, we have received and accepted the resignation of our dear leader, Senior Pastor Belita Mitchell. Amidst all of this, God has blessed us and our bond remains as strong as ever. This is truly a time to Give Thanks!!!

First, I want give thanks to God for the blessing of our Pastor and to reflect on all He was able to do through her time of service with us. For those who have been here that whole time, just take a moment and think about where we were as a congregation back in 2003 in comparison to where we are now. Our vision statement was just that, a far off minute possibility. These concerns have swiftly been answered as we have actually seen more people involved in Sunday Bible Study and Midweek Bible Study than when the building was open. We have also seen a higher number of attendees at our outdoor services than we have ever seen in years past. Just this last week, we were outside on an under 50 degree, rainy Sunday. Even so, a sizable group bundled up and gathered under our canopies and adjacent to our outdoor heaters to be together. People are checking in on each other, we continue to strengthen our relationships with one another and technology has enabled us to regularly worship together during this trying time.

Lastly, I want to give thanks to God for how He has enabled us to remain unified even as our nation seems fractured. This election season had the makings of dividing just about any sizable group of people, but regardless of our political leanings, we as a body have taken the lead to speak out, to welcome and to value the lives and the voices of the least, the last and the lost in our society. Right here in our midst, God is about knitting together a faith community that welcomes, values and empowers all people from all walks of life, and I have so much gratitude for Him who has begun this mighty work here at First Church

Even as we have much to be thankful for, we have so much more to pursue and to be about. My hope is that we will be about striving toward a reality when the chorus of the song "Give Thanks" doesn't seem like a far off pipe dream. "And now, let the weak say, 'I am strong,' Let the poor say, 'I am rich, because of what the Lord has done for us .""

Regardless of how this election goes, regardless of who the Lord blesses our faith community with as a next team member, and regardless of how soon we are able to resume gathering inside, we have so much to be thankful for. Let's continue to pursue the things that God has set before us, that His kingdom come and His will be done right here as it is in Heaven. Let it be so.

Special Announcement

October 25, 2020

To the Harrisburg First Church of the Brethren Congregation:

On September 9, 2020, Pastor Belita met with me to share her intent, after much prayerful consideration and consultation with family and trusted advisors, to move on from her position here at Harrisburg First Church of the Brethren effective December 31, 2020. I formally shared this with the Executive Committee and subsequently we as the Ministry Coordinating Team accepted her letter of resignation at our meeting on October 6, 2020.

This news certainly brings about a lot of emotion—anxiety, thankfulness, concern, and a hopefulness for both what God is doing with Pastor Belita and what He continues to do in this congregation (among what I imagine are many others). As we reflect on what this means for the congregation, we as the MCT became keenly aware of all that pastor Belita has meant to this body over the past 18 years. She brought to us the vision that we all share today:

"We are called to be a Christ-centered multi-cultural community in the inner city, Sharing the love, healing, peace and justice of Christ."

Pastor Belita has been the embodiment of this vision and has given this to us as a gift. At the local level, she has called us to a new level of awareness of the vision of Revelation 7:9 where "a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb." Look around you today and remember if you can what HFCOB looked like 18 years ago. And more than that, we have begun to have the challenging conversations and doing the difficult work of this vision as demonstrated most recently in our series on the complicity of the Church in racism in America.

Pastor Belita has been a voice for this vision denominationally through her work as Annual Conference Moderator among many other acts of service at both the national and district levels. It was under her guidance that the denomination was able to pass the Separate No More paper of 2007 which adopts this Revelation 7:9 vision as the "denominational vision for the remainder of the 21st century" We are at the center of what God is doing in the world today, and I am personally thankful for her leadership in this time!

But even more than that, Pastor Belita has walked with many of us through the realities of life. It is in these moments that we can be most thankful. It is the call of a pastor to pour out so much, and we are very thankful for all that has been poured into us over these past years. Whether you are new to the congregation or were part of the team that brought Belita on board so long ago, we are changed because of her commitment and sacrifice. It is a beautiful thing to see someone whom God has used so well.

Pastor Belita, we send you with our blessing and love. May the peace of Christ and the experiences we share guide us all from this place; and may we cry out together, Maranatha—"Come Lord Jesus"! Thank you our dear Sister and may God bless you until we meet again!
