A Reflection

As I reflect on the month of January and February, I think about the contribution I made within the Harrisburg community and First Church of the Brethren. I think about the time I get to spend helping out at food distribution Friday mornings, and my time helping the kids at Community Classroom (at the Journey Church). I enjoy helping out at the Journey Church because it brings back memory when I worked at a day-care back in high school. Matthew 20:28 reads, "just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many". Another thing in the months of January and February I grew more liking to is Agape. Every Wednesday night at 5 we meet in the Agape room (in the basement of the church). During this time, we watch movies and have deep and meaningful conversation pertaining to social and racial injustice. This has helped me more to understand that uncomfortable conversation is much needed to bring awareness to the so-

cial and racial injustice in our society, and the proactive measures we can take moving forward. Furthermore, I've been meeting with Dr. Hart every month, and he's been mentoring me on leadership and faith. These meetings with Dr. Hart have been meaningful and impactful in my life so far because he's someone who has a lot of experience in areas I need to improve and work on. Lastly, ever since I moved to Harrisburg, we have our community dinner every Thursday. We've had a lot of people over our (Ubuntu house) and we've cooked a lot of meals. It's been awesome interacting and eating with people who come over to our house and just being in fellowship with one another. -*Eric Joloka*



Our Mighty Fortress

Recently, I ventured into a part of the church that most of the people who attend there have never gone...The Attic. I took the roofer up so he could see an area of damage from underneath. The first thing that I noticed is just how stout our Sanctuary is. The oldest part of our church was built in 1905, back then unskilled labor was paid the princely sum of .15 cents an hour. Most people did not have electricity or running water. The church was lit with gas lamps, we still have the long pole they used to light them in the archive room. The beams that hold up the roof in the sanctuary are three inches thick and built of wood that has no knotholes. Wood such as that can no longer be purchased for any price it has simply been used up. Wood like that is very strong. Harrisburg had a planning mill where wood was cut and milled, it is a possibility that the beams that make up our church were given form just down the road from it. The nails that hold the building together are hand forged and square. Instead of a machine, someone had to heat up the metal red hot and make each and every one by hammering it out. The nails in our church are likely not much different than those that held Jesus to the cross and made exactly the same way. The handiwork of those craftsman has stood for nearly 120 years and with care will stand for many more. The craftsmen who built the nails and cut the wood did so knowing that no one would see their work directly but that it

was a part of a greater whole. Both are vital. Without either the building would not exist. I am reminded of a Hymn written by Martin Luther called "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God". Our church is a mighty building but without the people that fill it, it is simply an empty shell. Our church has been empty too long. I hope before I depart in August that I can see the sanctuary completely full of people again. - Daniel Wright

Youth/Young Adult Group Updates: Back Up And Semi-Running


In the last few months the youth and young adults at Harrisburg First have gathered in person every other week.



What the Spiritual Life Team and Ministries are all about here at 1st Church

Here at Harrisburg First COB our leadership is affirmed at Church Councils and the Spiritual Life Team is just one part of the church's working teams. We assist the pastoral staff in caring for the physical, spiritual and emotional needs of our church family. God blessed us in 2020 with more than 28 new attendees to our outside services and they keep interacting virtually. About 20 plus others have reconnected and are attending again as well. This is an answered prayer, let the Church say "Praise God!" The Spiritual Life Team coordinates First Church's Deacon Ministry and we currently have 21 deacons who serve eleven deacon zones of members and regular church attenders. Most deacons have been in touch with those new to their zones. God is moving our church and it takes dedication, prayer and God's love to be in community. Please take time to know who your deacon is and get to know him/her. Let us know your needs, your gifts of how you too can serve or "be" for each other. If you are feeling the tug of the Holy Spirit to be called to this ministry, to be disciples or deacons, we encourage you to discuss this calling with our pastoral staff or your deacon. Deacons respond to the needs of the church through "Deacons of the month," visits, delivering the altar flowers to hospitalized or home bound persons and post Covid-19 connecting by email, text, card or call. Deacons of the month get to know others beyond their zone and purposefully serve the church body's needs that month with the pastoral team & staff. The Spiritual Life Team including many volunteers assist with planning Love Feast, communion (in worship and in home), anointing, funeral luncheons & baptism. Spiritual growth opportunities including devotionals, scriptures / uplifting encouragement, Zoom bible study on Sundays & midweek are communicated by email or monthly "Growing Edge." College student care packages & Holiday Widow / Widower cookie tubs are organized by the Spiritual Life Team. Our Anabaptist Disabilities Network and Healing Communities Network Representative, Mark Pickens, reports to the Spiritual Life Team. HFCOB is recognized by the Church of the Brethren as an Open Roof Fellowship. The Healing Communities Network representative reports to the Spiritual Life Team. HFCOB is a Station of Hope, welcoming our brothers / sisters returning from prison, creating a culture of healing and restoration for people affected by crime and incarceration. We have an active prayer ministry through our email prayer chain. Please continue to be in prayer, to share your concerns / testimonies and contribute ways we can continually the work of Jesus peacefully, simply, together!




Why do we have to pay for Annual Conference if it's online?
