#### **DISCERNING TOGETHER**

ummer has been full of life and opportunity. Over the past couple of months we have had people from our congregation attending National Young Adult Conference, Annual Conference, and National Youth Conference. Pastor Josiah led a FaithX trip to Rwanda and we hosted a junior high FaithX group during our VBS week. In many ways, this summer has emphasized connection and relationship building, especially across the denomination. As wonderful as it has been getting to travel and meet new people, I am always happy to return home. And now that many of our busy summer activities have finally settled, Pastor Josiah and I have made more of an effort to intentionally discuss and vision together the future of our faith family. Yet, this discernment process is never easy.

In fact, discerning the will of God is one of the most difficult things to do. How can we as human beings possibly figure out what God is up to? In moments where I feel inadequate in my discernment, I am grateful for scripture that reminds me that discerning the will of God is a group effort.1 Corinthians 14:29 instructs us to "Let two or three prophets speak, and let the others weigh what is said." As a church family we continue to discuss and discern the mission of our church and the future of our lives together. And when the discernment process points us into uncertain territory, I think about the Story of Sarah and Abraham.

In Genesis 17: 1-2 it tells us that "When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." God did new and surprising things for Abraham and Sarah even in their old age. First Church has been a congregation here on Hummel St. since 1896. If God is capable and excited to do new things for Abraham and Sarah in their more seasoned years, I can only be filled with hope and anticipation of the beautiful things God has planned for us.

So August is primed to be a month where we can take some time to discern, pray, and plan for what will come in the new fall season. In September, we are planning to start our Adult Bible study back up. There are new potentialities on the horizon for our Spiritual Life Team. And, we look forward to having the first changes to our sanctuary windows finalized in the fall. There is still much to be done in the life of our church but just as we are not done with the work, God is not done with us.

#### THRIVING TOGETHER

For those who are unaware, we have been taking part in an initiative through Messiah College called Thriving Together: Congregations United for Social Justice. As part of this initiative, we have called a team of Alyssa Parker, Donna Benson and myself to be our representatives for the different enrichment activities that have been apart of the initiative. This past Sunday, our entire service was focused on different things we have been learning as we have taken part in the plethora of enrichment activities. If you were not present, I encourage you to check out the video on our YouTube Channel.

Some of what we have been learning is not new, such as the fact that racism is alive and well today. That it is not only a southern problem. That the Black Church has historically been a place of prophetic work towards racial justice and equity for all people. Donna shared during our 5th Sunday Service about a wonderful Civil Rights Bus Tour in which she was able to take part. Her photos and learnings really highlight all of the ugly things that were a part of life in the Jim Crow South and the resiliency, courage and perseverance that led to some real change in this country. The enduring message is that the work is still necessary as we have not yet arrived at a place where our country can truly be described as a place of "liberty and justice for all."

Some of what we have been learning is very new. Such as a new way of reading the scriptures described as Anti-Racist Spirituality and Anti-Racist Theology. Reading the scriptures, particularly the life of Jesus with new eyes will enable us to have a faith-filled grounding in the word which will help us to endure and persevere in the work that lies ahead. Alyssa did a wonderful job of outlining what these new eyes can help us to see

and some of what this new understanding can motivate us to be about.

Some of what we have been learning is motivational. We have been challenged to consider the Race and Place of our own Faith Community. To consider, how did South Allison Hill become the way it is today? How did Harrisburg First Church of the Brethren come into being and why? How have we interacted with our broader community during the days when land was stolen from Black and Brown people in order to build our State Capitol Complex. What about when the same people were displaced again in order to build more state government infrastructure along Forster Street. When our neighborhoods were literally burning due to rioting near the time of MLK, Jr's assassination and the Vietnam War Protests,

what part did we play? What did we do in the wake of the opioid epidemic and as Black Lives Matter Protests engulfed our nation? I describe this

study of Race and Place here on Hummel Street as motivational because it brings to mind all that God has brought us through already, how we have reacted and how we have interacted. Sometimes we have risen to the occasion and at others we have fallen short. I also describe it as motivational because it is work that is not yet done.

We must continue to research from whence we have come, to learn from our victories as well as our mistakes, to allow this work to propel us into the future that God has in store for this faith community. A day when we, along with all of our neighbors: our brothers, sisters and siblings; from every race, ethnicity, nation, sexual and gender identity, and socio-economic background; who call South Allison Hill home, can truly Thrive Together.










# Faith and Justice Corner

SCRIPTURES AND
MEDITATIONS ON THE
AFTERLIFE

Most people believe in an afterlife, but their views may be inspired more by culture than by Scripture. These views may not be accurate or satisfying. What does the Bible say about it? Rev. Bob Vroom, leads us through key biblical passages on death and the afterlife. He then applies these truths to our life now. A study guide is found at the end of each chapter, for use in small group study. The basis for our hope is not speculation or cultural ideas, but is found in the Word of God. The Bible gives us a hope that speaks to our deepest hurts and longings. When we meditate on what Scripture says, the overall picture we get is hopeful and inspiring. 
