As always, there continues to be much going on here at First Church. Sometimes doing ministry on Hummel Street can feel like things are moving a mile a minute! Yet, as I look over my calendar for this month, one of the things that I am eager to start is our Midweek Morning Meditations.

It has been difficult to plan for anything as we enter into the third year of the pandemic. I know that many of us have been itching to get back to the things we have been holding off and it is finally starting to seem like it's a possibility. As we look forward, in just one month the season of Lent will be upon us and God willing, it will also be when we start to bring back more of our usual programs and activities. However, before we jump into our normal routines, I am inclined to take a moment to pause.

In between some of the verses in the book of Psalms, there is a word that appears over and over again, Selah. The assumption is that this word was given as a direction. It is to indicate either to the lyricist or the listeners that they should leave space for a pause. When I'm about to start something new or enter into a season of change, I find it helpful to remember this direction from the Psalmist and take a moment to center down. Centering down for me is a time to reflect on the well-being of my spirituality. In his book, The Jesuit Guide to (Almost) Everything, James Martin S.J. clearly and concisely defines spirituality as "a way of living in relationship with God." The idea is simple enough. Yet, we all know that there are many different and unique ways of living life. Just as there are different ways of living, so too are their different ways of living in a relationship with God. For that reason, there exist various spiritual practices to help us find ways of deepening our relationship with God. As I continue to grow and participate in our denomination of the Church of the Brethren, there are ecumenical roots of mine that continue to influence my understanding of spirituality. In different seasons of my life, I have met God in prayer, in silence, in meditative practices, and in contemplative readings of scripture. It never ceases to amaze me how God reveals God's self to me! Yet, the common thread between them all is that God's presence was made known and walked with me forward, into whatever God had planned for me next.

So as we look to take steps forward, my prayer, as well as my invitation, is that somewhere in this next month, you will be able to take a moment to pause. I invite you to deepen your spiritual practices. Whether that is participating in something new or recommitting to your tried and true practice, I hope that centering down will renew your spirit so that you can say yes to the Holy Spirit.





Voices of the Eighth is a journey that transcends time to connect two African American teens from the same Harrisburg neighborhood. This heartwarming story connects the young and old, past and present, and gone but not forgotten, to celebrate the history-making contributions of African Americans who lived in the Old Eighth Ward. Poetry and music infuse this original play in which Kay, a soon-to-graduate high schooler, finds her voice and value during an encounter with the past. Voices of the Eighth is inspired by true stories and history-makers who lived between 1850 and 1920 in the rich and vibrant Old Eighth Ward, which was torn down to make way for the Capitol Complex we see today. During this journey from present to past and back again, Kay and Della meet some extraordinary abolitionists, activists, changemakers, and poets who were all instrumental in fighting for the freedom and rights we enjoy today: and they all came out of Harrisburg.


