Thriving At First Church






Faith and Justice Corner

"Thriving Together" Josiah Ludwick



Some of you are aware that Alyssa Parker, Donna Benson and myself have been a part of something called Thriving Together over the course of the past several months. This is a cohort of churches that are specifically looking at Racial Justice in the context of their own faith community's history, their present and looking into the future. Each gathering has included some reading, workshops, conversation and group work aimed at helping us get a full picture of what it would look like if we are effectively standing for racial justice where God has placed us. Our gathering this past weekend focused on the idea of Race and Place. We rehearsed the history of the Capital Region as relates to race and have been asked to do some work around researching our own congregation's role in how things have gotten to be the way they are today. During Abolition when Harrisburg was a stop on the Underground Railroad, what did Harrisburg First have to say about it? Did we participate in the Civil Rights Movement? When White Flight was sweeping over our community, how did we respond? These are just some of the questions we will be investigating in the coming months. While the three of us do this work, I want to encourage you to do likewise. Find out what indigenous peoples inhabited the land where you now reside. Some of our home addresses have the identities of Sun-Down Towns in their recent histories. Some continue to have Restrictive Deeds on the books. The way things are today didn't just happen coincidentally. Join us in investigating these histories so that we might gain a clearer picture of our present and plan for a brighter more inclusive future!


As a church on south Allison Hill, many of us have witnessed injustices first hand. Social Justice Library Book of the Month!




"When God Made You" by M. Turner Originally published: 2017

Congratulations to Lydia Pebly who, as a first-year teacher, was awarded Teacher of the Year at Hamilton. We thank God for the gifts given to those among us.




